Public Works/Parks

The contractor on the mill and overlay project continues to make progress with concrete repairs west of Highway 33. Things should pick up as they move to the east side with far fewer repairs needed.

Crews have kept busy with mowing, landscape maintenance, manhole and concrete repairs this week. Annual hydrant flushing began this week resulting in the identification of two needed repairs which were competed as well.

Staff has also been painting and preparing the Pinehurst Park pool area in preparation for the opening of "The Beach" as early as next week.

Economic Development

This week staff met with Engineering to discuss the framework of the input process for future Cloquet Avenue improvements. Staff consulted with MnDOT on Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) funding that may potentially assist with some aspects of the project. Engineering will address Council to seek further input at an upcoming Work Session as we begin to lay out a community engagement process and project scope.

MnDOT issued funding for the Transportation Economic Development (TED) program this week. Staff will attend that meeting in late June to learn more about this program. Staff also met with the Duluth Trades Union to discuss project labor agreements as they relate to city assisted, privately led economic development projects in Cloquet. The EDA will discuss the PLA Ordinance at their June 7th meeting. Developers who are affected by the new Ordinance plan to attend that meeting.

Building Inspections Services

Staff remained busy with residential and commercial inspections including a roofing inspection at the Cloquet High School. Staff followed up on several enforcement cases and issued a public nuisance violation in connection with a police case on Avenue B. Staff attended a building permit software demonstration with iWorQ and also consulted colleagues on CityView software which is a Harris program. The City currently uses a variety of Harris programs, however the current Municipal Manager program is not being supported by Harris and staff has struggled with their customer service transition and is in the process vetting if this can be resolved.
