### **PERSONNEL**

### **LMC POLICIES**

The League's Policy Committees adopted the 2016 Draft City Policies during their final meetings earlier this month. The draft policies are now available for members to review at the LMC website (www.lmc.org).

All member comments are shared with the League Board of Directors before the Board takes final action on the policies on Nov. 19th. The policies will serve as a framework for the League's advocacy efforts during the 2016 legislative session, which begins March 8, 2016.

## **BOARD VACANCIES**

Vacancies still remain for the Citizen's Advisory Board and Shaw Memorial Library Foundation. I encourage the City Council and staff to make contact with your friends and neighbors asking them to help by serving the citizens of our community.

# **WATER HEATER DEATH**

The water heater is in its death throes at the Public Safety Building. Unfortunately, its replacement cannot wait. Looks like approximately \$7,000 for the total bill of replacement and installation.

# **Community Development**

## Housing

Staff attended a meeting with DEED related to workforce housing programs. Housing continues to be a major topic of conversation with our economic development partners in Cloquet. A number of challenges are coming to light in terms of roles and responsibilities which are going to require some discussion with these partners.

## **LANDFILL AUDIT**

The audit of the Shamrock Host Fee Agreement is now complete. There is general compliance with most items and staff will now be sitting down with the company to review the audit results. One major finding was that the company has overpaid its host fees to the City which results in the City needing to reimburse the company.

# **Public Works/Parks**

## 8th STREET

The 8th street reconstruction project is for the most part wrapped up for the year.

## **WEST TAYLOR PAVING**

The City finished paving the new West Taylor Avenue this week. With all of the changes to the cul-de-sac area, the final project appears to have turned out quite well.

## **PINEHURST PARK**

Work continues at the Park with asphalt and concrete work now getting put down. The project continues to move along at a good pace and if the weather holds out, everything will remain on schedule.

## **HILLTOP PARK**

The Hilltop Park improvements are also nearing completion for the year. The new disk golf course has been installed and looks to be a real challenge weaving through the trees. There is still some signage and other minor things to complete, but be sure to stop and check it out.


## **MISCELLANEOUS**

RE: Safe Routes to School Grant and Proposed Slate Street Sidewalk Extension

# Dear Resident:

In 2012, the Cloquet School District successfully applied (with assistance from the Arrowhead Regional Development Commission) for a Minnesota Department of Transportation (MnDOT) Safe Routes to School (SRTS) planning grant. SRTS is a federally funded program intended to encourage children of all abilities to walk and bicycle to school. The Cloquet SRTS process was kicked-off in September 2012 with a site assessment and distribution of surveys to parents. The data collected was intern used by a local Safe Routes to School Committee to assemble a Cloquet Safe Routes to School Plan. One of recommendations to come out of this Plan was the extension of a sidewalk thru and east of Sunnyside Park connecting the Erickson Acres neighborhood which is currently without sidewalks.

Last year, a second allocation of SRTS dollars was made available for construction projects in the form of a competitive grant process. The City applied for funding as the local road authority and was awarded 80 percent matching funds towards the extension of a new sidewalk east along Slate Street. As staff begins to plan for possible 2016 construction, now is an excellent time to reach out to area residents.

Enclosed please find a map of the proposed project route. At this time, the City is proposing to extend the new walk from Sunnyside Park east along the north side of Slate Street to Jackson Avenue. The proposed walk would be five feet wide and located directly behind the existing curb in order to minimize impacts to the adjacent properties. While other routing options were explored, the North side of Slate appears the most feasible from a construction and financial standpoint.

The estimated cost of this project is approximately \$130,000, 80% of which would be funded using federal grant funds. The remaining \$25,000 would be matched locally using moneys from the City's municipal state-aid street, or general tax levy. As a designated state-aid street, none of the construction costs would be assessed or charged back to properties along the route.

On Monday, October 19, 2015 at 7:00 PM, the City has scheduled an informal Public Information Meeting to be held in the Council Chambers at City Hall (1307 Cloquet Avenue). At this meeting, staff will present the preliminary design, answer questions and take public input on the project.
