PRESENTATIONS

a. CAT-7 Update

Pete Radosevich gave a brief update on the status of CAT-7 since the Pine Knot News took over the station in January and began broadcasting in February, indicating things are going very well. Mr. Radosevich stated the goal is for CAT-7 to be a resource for the community by posting items and programs of public interest as well as events happening in the city. They also plan to begin live streaming of city meetings in the near future.

14th STREET RECONSTRUCTION UPDATE

Public Works Director Caleb Peterson updated Council members on the status of the 14th Street / CSAH 3 reconstruction project. Construction is scheduled to begin June 7th from Cloquet Avenue to Prospect Avenue. Roads will be closed with the exception of local traffic. Updated information will continue to be posted on the city's website as well as Council updates throughout the project.

PROJECT LABOR AGREEMENT DISCUSSION

Mayor Maki invited public comments at this time regarding the Project Labor Agreement Repeal, requesting no more than two people from each side comment. Individuals who spoke include:

- Craig Olson
- Wayne Nordeen

City Council discussion followed the public comments.

- Councilor Lamb stated she has had numerous conversations with City of Duluth officials and
 various individuals since the May 4th vote to repeal the City's PLA. After conversations and
 more research in the PLA lawsuits, she would like to change her vote to keep the PLA but with
 the language changes that were made.
- Councilor Wilkinson stated she would like to find balance to keep jobs local but not overlook problematic issues that come with the PLA.
- City Administrator Peterson clarified that the ordinance was to repeal the entire PLA and amendments could be discussed at a later date.
- Councilor Kolodge stated he agrees with City Administrator Peterson and would be in favor of
 considering compromise such as focusing on prevailing wage.
- Mayor Maki commented he is in favor of repealing the PLA but is willing to look at the
 prevailing wage aspect.
- Councilor Jaakola opposed the repeal of the PLA but is also interested in a compromise.
- Councilor Swanson stands by his vote to not repeal the PLA but understands the tension and
 concern, however, is not convinced the voices of the working people are heard. A compromise is
 worth considering but review amendments rather than removing PLA completely.

MOTION: Councilor Swanson moved and Councilor Kolodge seconded the motion to keep the PLA and reinstate as it was prior to May 4, 2021. Motion passed (4-3). Councilors Kolodge, Wilkinson and Mayor Maki opposed.

COUNCIL COMMENTS, ANNOUNCEMENTS AND UPDATES

- Mayor Maki commented on the Memorial Day program at Veterans Park. He also gave a reminder that Sr. Citizens' Day is June 15th with activities taking place at Veterans Park.
- Councilor Jaakola encouraged councilors to read the article in the Minnesota Cities magazine titled "Understanding Your City's Past to Advance Racial Equity".
- Councilor Wilkinson congratulated graduating seniors.
- Councilor Kolodge said its good to be back to in-person meetings.
- City Administrator Peterson welcomed councilors back and asked for input on removing the "Masks Required" signs in City Hall. Council agreed to remove them.

ADJOURNMENT

On a motion duly carried by a unanimous yea vote of all members present on roll call, the Council adjourned.

Labor Day Celebration

Proposed Action

Staff recommends that the City Council move to approve the request from the Carlton County Labor Day Celebration Committee for the closure of a section of Cloquet Avenue for the Labor Day parade, the use of Veterans Park for carnival activities, and for the City to waive the park fee.

Background/Overview

Each year, the Carlton County Central Labor Body works with local groups on a community celebration held on Labor Day. Enclosed, the City Council will find a request from the Carlton County Labor Day Celebration Committee seeking approval to hold such an event again this year. The requests are consistent with previous years' Labor Day celebrations.

The Committee is seeking the closure of Avenue C at 9:00 a.m. for parade set up and staging; closure of Cloquet Avenue from approximately 10:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. for the parade; and the use of Veterans Park from noon to 3:00 p.m. for carnival activities and picnic.

The Committee also is requesting the City waive the park fee as it has in the past for this event.

Policy Objectives

The City adopted a policy in 2009 that requires a fee for the use of community parks and facilities. In this case, the use of Veterans Park is not as a profit source for the Labor Body but is considered a community event. The Council has agreed to waive the fee with past requests.

Financial/Budget/Grant Considerations

By agreeing to waive the park rental fee, the City would lose \$400.

Background/Overview

The City has received an application from John Massari, Sky's the Limit, Inc., dba Generous Jerry's Fireworks for a Peddlers, Solicitors, & Transient Merchants license to sell fireworks from June 22 through July 6, 2021, between the hours of 9:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. in the parking lot of Super One Foods, 707 Hwy 33 South. SHORT-TERM LICENSE AGREEMENT

Agreement between Miner's Incorporated of 5065 Miller Trunk Highway, Hermantown, MN 55811 (Miner's), and John Massari Sky's The Limit Inc. d/b/a Generous Jerry's Fireworks, Inc. of 733 St. Mary's Rd., Libertyville, IL 60048 (Licensee), made as of May 32, 2021.

- 1. Agreement to License use of Premises. Miner's agrees to license to Licensee the right to use certain premises in Miner's possession on the terms and conditions stated in this License.
- 2. **Premises.** The premises licensed are located at Miner's following store locations and the location of the licensed area at each store is shown on the map attached hereto as **Exhibit A** (Premises):

Cloquet Super One Foods Pine Tree Plaza 707 Hwy. 33 South Cloquet, MN 55720 Virginia Super One Foods 1111 17th Street South Virginia, MN 55792

<u>Licensee's on-site structure (single tent and any other enclosure) may not exceed a total of 1,600 square feet.</u>

- 3. Term. The term of this License begins on June 20, 2021 and ends on July 7, 2021 (Term).
- 4. Compensation. Licensee shall pay Miner's at Miner's address stated above (or at such other address as Miner's may require) the greater of a nonrefundable license fee of per location or (compensation) combined sales, excluding sales tax, payable as follows:
 - a. Licensee will pay Miner's, without demand, on execution of this Agreement the sum of at Miner's address stated above (or at such other address as Miner's may require); and
 - b. the balance of the license fee shall be paid by Licensee on or before July 12, 2021.
 - c. In the event the covid-19 pandemic does not allow for the sale of fireworks, Generous Jerry's Fireworks would not be required to pay the agreed upon annual rent.
- fireworks (Class C) and related novelty items only. Miner's grants permission to Licensee to locate a temporary stand, kiosk, or tent on the Premises from which to sell its products. Licensee shall not permit any unlawful practice or activity to be carried on in the Premises; make any use of or allow the Premises to be used for any purpose that might invalidate or increase the rate of insurance thereof; create any nuisance or injure the reputation of Miner's; commit or suffer waste; permit any use prohibited by a zoning or building restriction; permit the use of radios, loudspeakers or other devices that can be heard outside the Premises; or place or erect any sign of any size, design and character which is visible outside premises without first receiving Miner's approval. Licensee's activities shall at all times conform to all state and local ordinances and licensing requirements. Licensee shall be responsible for the cost of procuring any state or local licenses required for the sale of its products.
- 6. Condition of the Premises. Prior to commencing operations, Licensee will inspect the Premises and unless Licensee delivers written notice to Licensor within 24 hours of the commencement date of this License to the contrary, Licensee shall be deemed to have acknowledged that the Premises are clean and in good order and repair, and Licensee accepts the Premises "as is."

- 7. Cleaning and Repairs. Licensee must keep the Premises clean and in good order and repair. In the event of a default by Licensee, Miner's may cause the Premises to be cleaned and make necessary repairs and charge the cost of such cleaning and repairs to Licensee as additional fees under this License.
- 8. Alterations. Licensee may not alter the Premises. Licensee agrees to properly patch any and all holes made by Licensee, remove all garbage and refuse, and return the Premises into the same condition as existed as of the first day of the Term.
- 9. Liability. Miner's is not liable for any loss, damage, or expense suffered by any person on or about the Premises, except that which is caused by Miner's negligence. If Miner's incurs any damage or expense due to any such claim, other than a claim arising from Miner's negligence, Licensee will reimburse Miner's for such damage or expense as additional fees under this License.

10. Insurance Requirements.

- a. No Liability For Loss. Miner's shall not be liable for any loss or damage to persons or property of Licensee or of its employees or invitees occasioned by or resulting from defects in the premises.
- b. Liability Insurance. Licensee agrees to carry and pay the premium for public liability insurance, insuring itself and Miner's against injury to property, person, or loss of life arising out of the use and occupancy of the Premises, or in any way occasioned by Licensee's business activities in conjunction with Licensee's use of the Premises, with limits of at least \$2,000,000 and shall furnish to Miner's a certificate of said insurance. Such policies of insurance shall not be canceled, discontinued, or altered without ten (10) days written notice to Miner's.
- Miner's, its agents and employees, from and against any and all claims, demands, actions, liabilities, damages, costs and expenses (including attorneys' fees), for injuries to any persons and damage to or loss of property occurring in or about the Premises and arising from the use and occupancy of the Premises or from any activity, work, or thing done, permitted or suffered by Licensee in or about the Premises or from any breach or default on the part of Licensee in the performance of any covenant or agreement on the part of Licensee to be performed under this License or due the negligence or willful misconduct of Licensee, its invitees, employees, contractors and agents. If any such proceeding is filed against Miner's or any such indemnified party, Licensee agrees to defend Miner's or such party in such proceeding at Licensee's sole cost by legal counsel reasonably satisfactory to Miner's.
- 11. Notices. All notices under this License must be in writing and either delivered personally or mailed by certified or registered mail, return receipt requested, to the address of Miner's, or if sent to Licensee to Licensee's address stated above.

12. Default and Remedies.

- a. Notice of Default. Miner's agrees to immediately notify Licensee by the most expeditious means available of any default by Licensee under this License.
- b. Termination of License. If Licensee fails to correct any default within 24 hours of receiving notice, or if Licensee fails to pay the fees provided for in this License on the due date, then Miner's may cancel this License and remove Licensee from the Premises without further notice. The foregoing notwithstanding, in the event Licensee is cited by law enforcement authorities for any unlawful sale of fireworks, this License shall automatically terminate immediately without notice to Licensee and Licensee shall immediately vacate the Premises. Licensee remains liable, after such termination, eviction, or vacation for all fees, costs, and damages provided in this License.

- c. Compensation for Unexpired Term. If this License is terminated due to Licensee's default, all fees payable by Licensee during the entire Term as provided in this License become immediately due and fully payable.
- d. Other Remedies. If this License is terminated due to Licensee's default, Miner's may, in addition to any other rights and remedies available to Miner's, enter the Premises and have Licensee and Licensee's property removed at Licensee's sole cost and expense.
- 13. Surrender. At the end of the Term or earlier termination of this License, Licensee will quit and surrender the Premises in as good order and condition as on the commencement date of this License, except for ordinary wear and tear and damage by the elements.

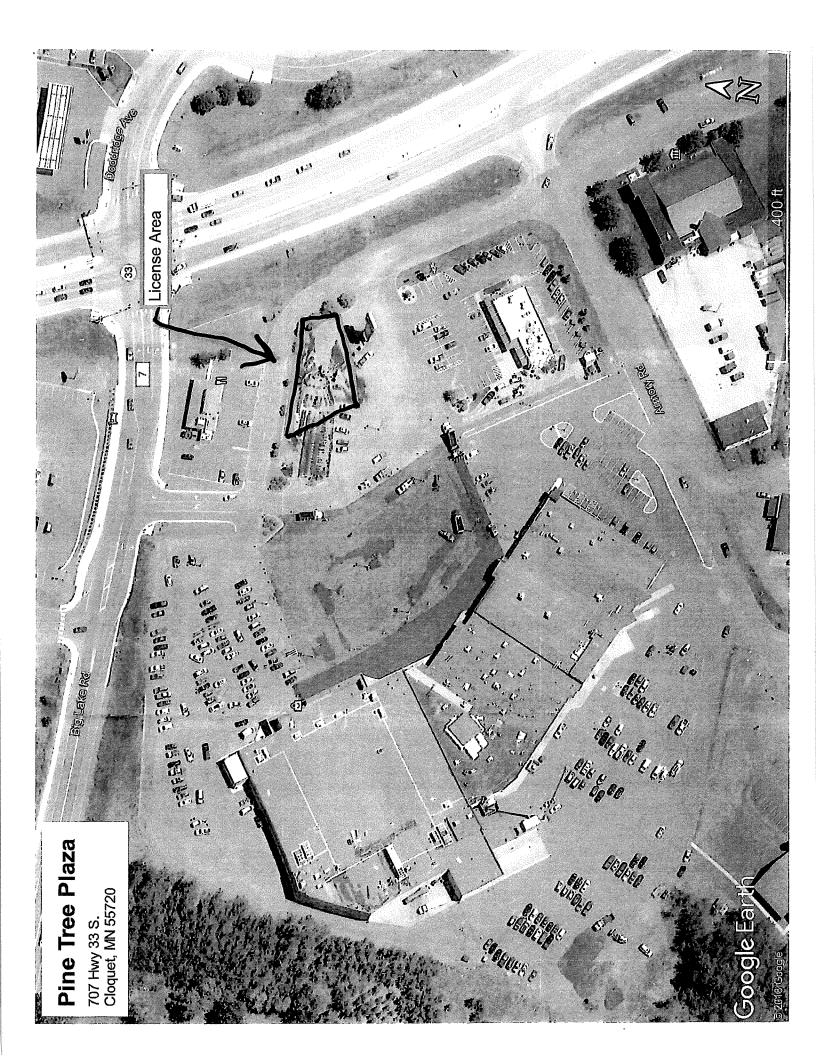

Award 2021 Gravel Crushing Bid

Proposed Action

Staff recommends that the City Council move to authorize the purchase of approximately 3,000 cubic yards of Class 5 gravel from D&B Trucking in an amount not to exceed \$50,000.

Background/Overview

Public Works includes funds in the operating budget each year for gravel. These stockpiles are used for a variety of purposes in daily operations including utility repairs and grading of our various gravel roads.

In the past, most of our gravel has been acquired by crushing to recycle salvaged bituminous pavement and concrete. Crushing was last completed in 2018 and current stockpiles are to the point where more material is needed before winter. Unfortunately, raw materials in the pit are not of sufficient supply to conduct crushing operations this year. Staff is proposing to purchase a 1–2-year supply of gravel from a local pit and crushing operations will be revisited in the future as materials become available.

Ouotes were solicited to deliver and stack approximately 2,500 cubic yards of material as follows:

Policy Objectives

To solicit bids for required road and utility maintenance materials in accordance with the City's purchasing policy and state statute.

Financial/Budget/Grant Considerations

The General Fund budget includes \$50,000 each year for gravel purchases and 75% of the use/cost is allocated to utility funds via transfers. Based on the bid amount, staff recommends the purchase of 3,000 yards of Class 5 gravel for total expenditure of approximately \$47,500.

Rescind Sick Leave During COVID-19 Pandemic Policy

Proposed Action

Staff recommends that the City Council move to rescind the City's temporary "Sick Leave During COVID-19 Policy" as of June 27, 2021.

Background/Overview

By request of City Staff, Council unanimously approved this temporary policy to help contain the spread of COVID-19 among City workers.

Under this policy staff were instructed to leave work immediately, if ill, to avoid exposing coworkers. They were to remain home until completely recovered, or COVID-19 was ruled out. Staff were also instructed on what to do when they came in contact with someone who had or were suspected to have COVID-19; they were to report this information to their supervisor/HR and stay home until the virus was ruled or they were completely recovered.

Under this policy staff were granted paid sick leave that did not count against their sick leave bank. This policy resulted in a total of 63 individual events with **zero** employee-to-employee spread of COVID-19.

Policy Objectives

To encourage employees to self-report illness and or potential exposure controlling the spread of COVID-19.

RE: Sick Leave during COVID-19 Pandemic Policy

Dear City of Cloquet Employees:

The City of Cloquet is monitoring the current coronavirus (COVID-19) situation. The City would like to remind you if you are ill, you should leave work immediately to avoid exposing coworkers. You should stay home until you are completely recovered, or the pandemic flu virus has been ruled out. The City currently offers numerous leave and absence policies to assist employees during incidences of their own illness or that of their immediate family member as outlined in the City of Cloquet, Personnel Policies Handbook and other temporary City Policies.

As a reminder the City would like to make you aware of how sick leave may be used for an employee who has been exposed to "a contagious disease of such a nature that his/her presence at the workplace could endanger the health of others." Sick leave may also be used to care for an ill "spouse, father, father-in-law, mother mother-in-law, stepparent, grandparent, grandchild, sister or brother, or other members of the employee's household."

If you have been in contact with someone who is suspected of having the virus, you should report this information to your supervisor and stay home until the pandemic virus has been ruled out for the original contract person or for you or until you have recovered fully.

In the event that an employee, your significant other, or child (who is under the care of the employee) has tested positive for COVID-19 or needs to be self-quarantined, pending a doctor's written notice, an employee may be eligible to receive paid sick leave and not have it counted against their current sick leave bank.

In order for an employee to receive their regular wages, any outside compensation received during this absence or arising from the COVID-19 pandemic must be turned over to the City.

Furthermore, a physician's statement shall be required on the employee's first day back to work, indicating the nature of the illness or medical condition and attesting to the employee's ability to return to work.

When an employee is asymptomatic (i.e. healthy, not displaying symptoms of the COVID-19 disease) and is subject to movement restrictions (quarantine or isolation) under the direction of public health authorities due to significant risk of exposure to a quarantinable communicable

disease such as COVID-19. That employee will be placed on paid administrative leave by the City and continue to receive all pay and allowances otherwise entitled too until such time as they are released from quarantine or isolation by a public health authority.

If you are a part-time employee and not eligible for paid sick leave and meet all the criteria listed in this letter you will be able to participate in a special extended leave program which is only available during the COVID-19 pandemic. Part-time employees in this situation will be eligible to receive a prorated wage, based on their average weekly schedule.

Please note, this policy is temporary and will only remain in effect until such time that COVID-19 is not perceived as a threat to the general public. Therefore, this policy is subject to change at any given notice.

Staff recommends that the City Council move to approve **Resolution 21-30 CALLING FOR A PUBLIC HEARING ON THE PROPOSAL OF A HOUSING PROGRAM FOR, AND THE ISSUANCE OF, REVENUE BONDS** on July 6, 2021.

Background/Overview

Minnesota Statutes, Chapter 462C gives cities the power to issue revenue bonds to finance or refinance a program for the purposes of planning, administering, making, or purchasing loans with respect to one or more multifamily housing developments within the boundaries of a city.

HADC Cloquet, LLC has proposed that it will use the proceeds of the Bonds to:

- (i) refund the outstanding principal balance of the Housing Facilities Revenue Refunding Bonds (HADC Cloquet, LLC Project), Series 2013A, issued by the City in the original aggregate principal amount of \$9,315,000, in order to refinance an integrated senior housing campus comprised of a 59-unit assisted living and care suites facility that is known as "Evergreen Knoll" and an immediately adjacent 24-unit senior independent living rental housing facility, that is known as "Evergreen Cottages";
- (ii) finance certain capital improvements to the Facilities,
- (iii) refund certain corporate indebtedness of the Borrower that was used to finance the acquisition, construction, and equipping of certain capital improvements to the Facilities, and
- (iv) pay all or a portion of the costs of issuance of the Bonds.

The aggregate estimated principal amount of the Bonds to finance the Project and related costs will be an amount not to exceed \$10,000,000.

The bonds, as and when issued, will not constitute a charge, lien, or encumbrance upon any property of the City. Such Bonds will not be a charge against the general credit or taxing powers of the City, but are payable from sums to be paid by the HADC Cloquet, LLC. pursuant to a revenue agreement.

- (a) WHEREAS, Minnesota Statutes, Chapter 462C (the "Act"), confers upon cities the power to issue revenue bonds to finance or refinance a program for the purposes of planning, administering, making, or purchasing loans with respect to one or more multifamily housing developments within the boundaries of a city; and
- (b) WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Cloquet, Minnesota (the "City") has received a proposal from HADC Cloquet, LLC, a Minnesota limited liability company (the "Borrower"), whose sole member is Housing Alternatives Development Company, a Minnesota nonprofit corporation and an organization described in Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code"), that the City assist in financing a Project described in Exhibit A, which will be located in the City, through the issuance of one or more series of taxable or tax-exempt revenue bonds or other obligations pursuant to the Act (the "Bonds"); and
- (c) WHEREAS, before proceeding with consideration of the request of the Borrower it is necessary for the City to hold a public hearing on the proposal pursuant to the Act and Section 147(f) of the Code;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Cloquet, Minnesota, as follows:

- 1. A public hearing on the proposal of the Borrower will be held at the time and place as determined by the City Administrator, which will be set forth in a Notice of Public Hearing substantially in the form attached hereto as Exhibit A (the "Notice").
- 2. On the basis of information available to the City, the general nature of the Project and an estimate of the principal amount of Bonds to be issued to finance the Project are described in the Notice.
- 3. The City Administrator is hereby authorized and directed to cause notice of the hearing to be given one publication in the official newspaper of the City and a newspaper of general circulation available in the City, not less than 15 days nor more than 30 days prior to the date fixed for the hearing, substantially in the form of the Notice, with such changes as required or approved by Taft Stettinius & Hollister LLP acting as bond counsel.
- 4. A draft copy of the housing finance program with proposed forms of all attachments and exhibits will be on file in the office of the City Administrator from the date the Notice of Public Hearing is published.

- 5. The Borrower has agreed and it is hereby determined that any and all costs incurred by the City in connection with the financing of the Project whether or not the Project is carried to completion will be paid by the Borrower.
- 6. Taft Stettinius & Hollister LLP, acting as bond counsel, is authorized to assist in the preparation and review of necessary documents relating to the Project, to consult with Borrower and the purchasers of the Bonds as to the maturities, interest rates and other terms and provisions of the Bonds and as to the covenants and other provisions of the necessary documents and submit such documents to the City for final approval.
- 7. Nothing in this Resolution or the documents prepared pursuant hereto shall authorize the expenditure of any municipal funds on the Project other than the revenues derived from the Project or otherwise granted to the City for this purpose. The Bonds shall not constitute a charge, lien or encumbrance, legal or equitable, upon any property or funds of the City except the revenue and proceeds pledged to the payment thereof, nor shall the City be subject to any liability thereon. The holders of the Bonds shall never have the right to compel any exercise of the taxing power of the City to pay the outstanding principal on the Bonds or the interest thereon, or to enforce payment thereon against any property of the City, except such property as may be expressly pledged for the security of the Bonds. The Bonds shall recite in substance that the Bonds, including the interest thereon, are payable solely from the revenue and proceeds pledged to the payment thereof. The Bonds shall not constitute a debt of the City within the meaning of any constitutional or statutory limitation.
