## ORDERING THE DEMOLITION OF A PUBLIC NUISANCE AND HAZARDOUS STRUCTURE

MOTION: Councilor Lamb moved and Councilor Wilkinson seconded the motion to approve

RESOLUTION NO. 22-04, ORDERING THE REMOVAL OF A PUBLIC NUISANCE AND HAZARDOUS ACCESSORY STRUCTURE AT 203 AVENUE

**D, CLOQUET, MN.** The motion carried unanimously (6-0).

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to Cloquet City Code §§ 10.3.07 subd. 1 and 7.1.01 to 7.1.07 and Minn. Stat. §§ 463.15 to 463.25, the City Council of the City of Cloquet finds that an accessory structure on the property located at 203 Avenue D, Cloquet, MN (PIN 06-045-4740), owned by Renee Keene (herein OWNER), to be a hazardous condition for the following reasons:

- 1. The City Building Official issued an Order to Repair or Remove Hazardous Conditions related to an accessory structure on June 10, 2021 providing 75 days to repair or remove the hazard. This Order further outlined the issues with the accessory structure/garage as mentioned in the June 8, 2021 structural report of TKDA which was also provided to OWNER. The Order to Repair states "the north wall of the garage is not plumb as a result of the northwest foundation corner of the garage support having washed away and shifting the accessory structure." These structural issues are partially due to the failing retaining wall with the property to the north.
- 2. A deadline reminder letter was sent to OWNER on August 5, 2021 along with the June 10, 2021 Order to Repair and attachments including the TKDA report of June 8 2021.
- **3.** A follow up letter was sent to OWNER on September 20, 2021 acknowledging OWNER's response on September 15, 2021 stating a friend will remove the hazardous accessory structure/garage by October 31, 2021. To date, the structure/garage remains on the property, has not been repaired, and no building permits have been issued for future work.

WHEREAS, the conditions listed above, which are more fully documented in the Order to Repair prepared by Building Official Matt Munter on June 10, 2021, a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit A, which conditions have further deteriorated to date, make clear that due to neglect and deterioration, the accessory structure/garage located on the property at 203 Avenue D constitutes a hazard to public health and safety, and is therefore declared to be a Public Nuisance and Hazardous Accessory Structure; and

**WHEREAS**, the legal description for 203 Avenue D is as follows:

That part of Block 39, City of Cloquet, described as follows: Commencing at the Southeasterly corner of Block 39, thence Westerly along the Southerly line of Block 39 distance 34.0 feet to the ACTUAL point of beginning; thence continuing Westerly along said Southerly block line distance 42.6 feet; thence Northerly and parallel with the Easterly line of Block 39 distance 99.2 feet; thence Easterly and parallel with the Southerly line of Block 39 distance 44.3 feet; thence Southerly to the ACTUAL point of beginning; Carlton County, Minnesota.

WHEREAS, the owner of record of said property is Renee Keene.

**WHEREAS**, OWNER has failed to comply with the June 10, 2021 Order to Repair or Remove Hazardous Conditions related to an accessory structure; and

WHEREAS, the City may proceed with demolition of the hazardous accessory structure/garage through a court order, or by signed Consent from OWNER, pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 463.151, allowing City to perform any demolition and cleanup that is necessary, to remove the Public Nuisance and Hazardous Accessory Structure, and to charge any costs thereby incurred by the City as a special assessment against the property, payable in up to five equal annual installments at 8% per annum, or payable in a single installment if proceeding by court order; and

**WHEREAS**, bids for demolition and cleanup of the accessory structure which constitutes a Public Nuisance and Hazardous Accessory Structure at 203 Avenue D have been received in amounts ranging from \$6,300 to \$8,842.50.

# NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CLOQUET, MINNESOTA, as follows:

1. That pursuant to the foregoing findings, incorporated herein and made a part hereof, and in accordance with Cloquet City Code § 7.1.07, and Minn. Stat. § 463.15 to § 463.25 (as appropriate), the Council orders the demolition and cleanup of the structurally

compromised accessory building at 203 Avenue D, which constitutes a Public Nuisance and Hazardous Accessory Structure, which cleanup shall be commenced by City or any of its designated agents as soon thereafter as is reasonably possible, according to the OWNER's Consent to Enter Property for Removal of Public Nuisance and Hazardous Accessory Structure or by court order.

- 2. That in accordance with Minn. Stat. § 463.21 & § 463.24, when said Public Nuisance and Hazardous Accessory Structure is cleaned up and removed by the City, the City may sell personal property, fixtures, and/or salvage materials at public auction after three days posted notice, or if without appreciable value, the City may destroy the same.
- 3. That the Council approves a payment of up to \$8,842.50 in demolition and cleanup costs by the City which will be specially assessed against the property, along with administrative and legal costs and fees as required, which shall be collected in accordance with Minn. Stat. §§ 463.151, and 463.21, and shall be payable in up to five payments at 8% per annum interest. The Council further approves a no-fee demolition permit; however, a permit must be pulled by the contractor hired by the City with inspections to be conducted by the City.
- 4. That the City Administrator, City Attorney and Mayor are hereby authorized to proceed with the preparation and execution of all documents and the taking of all actions necessary for enforcement of this Resolution/Order, including proceeding by court action or obtaining a Consent to Enter Property for Removal of Public Nuisance and Hazardous Accessory Structure from the OWNER.

## AGREEMENT FOR PEDESTRIAN BRIDGE SCOPING STUDY

#### SOLICITATION OF BIDS FOR 2022 PAVEMENT MANAGEMENT PROJECT

**MOTION:** 

Councilor Carlson moved and Councilor Lamb seconded the motion to approve **RESOLUTION NO. 22-06, APPROVING THE SOLICITATION OF BIDS FOR 2022 PAVEMENT MANAGEMENT PROJECT.** The motion carried unanimously (6-0).

WHEREAS, The City has identified maintaining its street infrastructure is a priority; and

**WHEREAS**, The Streets contained in the proposed 2022 Pavement Management Project are in need of maintenance; and

**WHEREAS**, Mill and Overlay / Reclaim has been determined to be the best maintenance strategy to preserve the pavement and extend the service life of the pavement; and

**WHEREAS,** it is most cost effective to complete all other ancillary concrete repairs along with the pavement repair; and

WHEREAS, The City now wishes to proceed with these improvements.

## NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CLOQUET, MINNESOTA:

- 1. Such plans and specifications are hereby approved.
- 2. The City Engineer is hereby authorized to advertise and solicit bids for such Improvements.

## PARKING RESTRICTIONS ON 22<sup>ND</sup> STREET FROM CLOQUET AVE TO CARLTON AVE

MOTION: Councilor lamb moved and Councilor Wilkinson seconded the motion to approve RESOLUTION NO. 22-07, RELATING TO PARKING RESTRICTIONS ON 22<sup>ND</sup> STREET FROM CLOQUET AVENUE TO CARLTON AVENUE. The motion carried unanimously (6-0).

**WHEREAS**, The City has planned the improvement of 22<sup>nd</sup> Street, State Aid Route No. 113 from Cloquet Avenue to Carlton Avenue and

**WHEREAS**, The City is expending Municipal State Aid Funds on the improvement of this street; and

**WHEREAS**, this improvement does not provide for adequate width for parking on both sides of the street and approval of the proposed construction as a Municipal State Aid Street Project must therefore be conditioned upon certain parking restrictions;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CLOQUET, MINNESOTA:

That the City shall allow no parking of motor vehicles on 22<sup>nd</sup> Street from Cloquet Avenue to Carlton Avenue.

## SOLICITATION OF BIDS FOR THE LAWRENCE ROAD WATER EXTENSION

**MOTION:** 

Councilor Jaakola moved and Councilor Carlson seconded the motion to approve RESOLUTION NO. 22-08, A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE SOLICITATION OF BIDS FOR THE LAWRENCE ROAD WATER EXTENSION. The motion carried unanimously (6-0).

- 1. **WHEREAS**, the City of Cloquet has prepared plans and specifications for the extension of watermain along Lawrence Road connecting two existing dead-end legs in the system and;
- 2. **WHEREAS**, this project has been included in the current Capital Improvement Plan and 2022 Budget and;
- 3. **WHEREAS**, the watermain loop will alleviate problematic operational pressure spikes being observed in the existing system;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CLOQUET, MINNESOTA:

Such improvement is hereby ordered and the City Engineer is hereby authorized to solicit bids for construction.

Authorization for Appointment of a Police Officer

#### **Proposed Action**

Staff recommends the City Council move to approve the probationary appointment of Dariano Giancola to a police officer position.

#### **Background/Overview**

The 2022 budget includes approved funding for 24 sworn police officers sworn who provide services to the cities of Cloquet, Scanlon, and a portion of the Fond du Lac Indian Reservation. These staffing levels are consistent with the 2014 Law Enforcement Analysis of the Cloquet Police Department by the Upper Midwest Community Policing Institute, in conjunction with the Minnesota Chiefs of Police Association's identified best practices and optimum staffing levels to provide and manage police services. The latest Novak Consulting firm's 2019 assessment of the department also supports this staffing number.

Currently, active department staffing is at 23 sworn officers of the established 24. (We are presently still one officer short.) we have two commanders, four patrol sergeants, one full-time detective, an "officer in investigations" position, one K-9 handler, one School Resource Officer, and ten patrol officers.

The shortage of sworn personnel has created challenges at the department regarding appropriate staffing levels, budgetary issues related to shift-replacement overtime, and available staff to keep up with the administrative duties.

In August 2021, we began the hiring process. The process included a pre-screening questionnaire, a written exam, and oral interviews. After those steps, the background investigation, physical exam, psychological exam, and fitness test were conducted on the top candidates.

Mr. Giancola has completed the required medical and psychological assessment and is recommended for employment.

After hiring, all new officers are required to complete three months of field training and have a one-year probationary period.

#### Candidate Background/Bio

Mr. Giancola, better known as Dar, has lived and grown up in the area. He graduated from Esko High School and graduated from the Fond du Lac Tribal and Community College's Law Enforcement program. Dar enjoyed playing hockey, soccer, and football for Cloquet/Esko/Carlton teams.

After college, Dar worked as a security officer while pursuing a police officer position.

In his free time, Dar likes to spend time outdoors with his new puppy and with his girlfriend, Olivia, who is also a police officer in a nearby community.

Dar is excited to serve as a police officer in the community he grew up in, as this area is special to him. Dar told me he is committed to building strong, professional, and meaningful relationships with our community members in his new role and looks forward to serving in this fulfilling career.

#### **Police Objectives**

The hiring of this position is consistent with previous actions of the City Council. It will allow the Police Department to continue to provide a full level of service to our community by maintaining adequate staffing levels.

#### Financial/Budget/Grant Considerations

The City has no other financial implications as the positions are included in the 2022 budget.

#### **Advisory Committee/Commission Action**
