#### **MINUTES**

The minutes of the March 7, 2022 regular meeting were presented. Motion to approve by Commissioner Urbanski and 2<sup>nd</sup> by Commissioner Buhs, motion carried 4-0.

#### **ANNOUNCEMENTS**

Staff introduced the new Parks Commissioner Matt Collins.

### **COMMUNITY ED**

Erin Bates reports that the Lumber Log is out and registrations for classes has begun. The Age to Age activities happening in the Parks is being planned. Grandmas will be holding one of their Wednesday Nights at the Races in Cloquet, the fees for the use of the track have been waived by the Cloquet School Board. One of the lifeguards has been certified as an instructor now and will be re-certifying some lifeguards on May 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> and later in May will be training some new lifeguards. The new registration system for The Beach will also be used to check folks at The Beach. The new system seems to be user friendly so far. Life jackets will be required this year for kids under 12. The teen registration for those at the pool without an adult will include contact information for those teens if a contact may be needed. Commissioner Badger asked about the number of days closed last year due to lack of lifeguards. There were several closures, including July 1<sup>st</sup> to the 4<sup>th</sup>. This year the staffing practices will be managed differently with requests for days off to be made in advance and allowed vacations will be planned and limited to only some of the crew.

#### **CITY STAFF REPORT**

Per Staff, the Boldt Clean Up day will be held April 30<sup>th</sup> in and around Dunlop Island. Rink attendance was discussed, along with days closed and rink conditions. Staff thanks Commissioner Krohn for the Friends of Cloquet Parks donation. Maps for Pine Valley with the locations and examples for way finding signage were shared, Commissioners shared their suggestions, and the final decisions are pending. The upgrades for the Pine Valley timing shack were discussed. The capital will all come from fund raising which is being spearheaded by David Johnson, a Nordic Ski Coach at Marshall. Boldt will donate some of their time and City employees will also work on the upgrades. The SWCD (Carlton Soil and Water Conservation District) will be working with a MN Conservation Corps crew to treat and remove Buckthorn, around the hospital. City maintenance crews are currently working on some painting projects indoors, as well as some garbage pickup and animal waste pickup in the parks. The last two features for Braun Park were put together.


## **ACTION ITEMS**



**ITEM DESCRIPTION:** Trails Edge Park Dedication - Cash In lieu of Land

# **Proposed Action**

Staff recommends the Park Commission MOVE TO RECOMMEND TO THE CITY COUNCIL THE TRAILS EDGE PARK DEDICATION - CASH IN LIEU OF LAND.

#### **Background/Overview**

Trails Edge Second Addition has made a request to donate land within the subdivision to fulfill the parks dedication component, as required by city code. The preservation of wetland areas within a subdivision is also required under the Wetland Conservation Act. After careful consideration Planning Department staff is recommending not to accept wetlands as a Park Dedication but rather accept money in lieu of land dedication.

Under the current City Code, Subdivision Regulations, Chapter 13.1.09 Subdivision 1.A, Where a proposed public park, recreation area or open space, as determined by the Comprehensive Plan, Planning Commission and/or City Council, is located in whole or in part within a subdivision, the subdivider shall make available such lands to the City of Cloquet, provided, however, that the total dedication shall not exceed ten percent of the total gross acreage owned or controlled by the subdivider in the case of proposed subdivision of five lots or more.

To clarify, staff will ask developer to pay the city 10% of the market value in lieu of the land dedication. The proposed area is classified as wetlands and not a usable space for park purposes.

### Financial/Budget/Grant Considerations

Staff has not finalized the dollar amount at this time. Reviewing 2020 Carlton County tax records, the property is valued at \$71,000. 10% of 2020 value equates to \$7,100.00 and will be placed in Park Dedication Fund. This fund is allocated solely for the acquisition of land for public parks, recreation areas or open spaces, development of existing parks and recreation areas, or debt retirement in connection with lands previously acquired for parks, recreation area or open spaces.
