OPEN WARD 3 COUNCIL SEAT

MOTION:

Councilor Carlson moved and Councilor Jaakola seconded the motion to accept applications from interested and eligible residents of Ward 3 to fill the open Ward 3 City Council seat the next general election. The motion carried unanimously (6-0).

2023 NON-UNION PAY PLAN

MOTION: Councilor Lamb moved and Councilor Kolodge seconded the motion to approve a 3.5

percent wage increase to the non-union employee pay plan effective January 1, 2023.

The motion carried unanimously (6-0).

AMENDING CHAPTER 3 OF CITY CODE AS IT RELATES TO SPECIAL TAXES – FIRST READING

Council is asked to review proposed **RESOLUTION NO. 22-85, APPROVING ORDINANCE NO. 503A, AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 3 OF CITY CODE AS IT RELATES TO SPECIAL TAXES.** Action will be taken at the December 20, 2022 Council meeting.

WHEREAS, In 2021, First Special Session, Chapter 14, Article 8, Section 4, ("Special Law") allows the City of Cloquet to pursue a local option sales tax.

WHEREAS, on the 20th day of July, 2021 the City Council of the City of Cloquet approved this legislation and authorized staff to take necessary action to create a referendum at the next general election for the voters of Cloquet to approve, or not, the additional local option sales tax.

WHEREAS, at the November 8, 2022 general election, voters in the City of Cloquet approved referendum question one as it relates to a project and funding for Pine Valley Park, and referendum question two as it relates to a project and funding for the Cloquet Ice Arenas.

WHEREAS, the Special Law is effective upon approval by a majority vote of the City Council and filing a certificate with the Minnesota Secretary of State, all in accordance with Minnesota Statutes, Section 645.021, Subd. 2 and 3; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that it is in the best interest of the City and its residents to approve the Special Law;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CLOQUET, MINNESOTA:

- 1. That the Special Law is hereby approved in all respects.
- 2. That Ordinance 503A is hereby approved to amend Chapter 3 of the City Code as it relates to Special Taxes.
- 3. That the City Administrator is authorized and directed to file with the Secretary of State a Certificate of Approval for the Special Law
- 4. That the City Administrator is authorized and directed to file with the Minnesota Department of Revenue all necessary documents and formal request for the Minnesota Department of Revenue to administer the new tax beginning April 1, 2023.
- 5. That City staff are authorized and directed to take all actions necessary to implement the Special Law and bring before this Council further proceedings as necessary in order to implement the Special Law.

PURCHASE 40 MM LESS-LETHAL LAUNCHERS

APPROVING THE COMPREHENSIVE PLAN AMENDMENT

MOTION: Councilor Kolodge moved and Councilor Lamb seconded the motion to approve

RESOLUTION NO. 22-82, A RESOLUTION APPROVING THE COMPREHENSIVE PLAN AMENDMENT (LAND USE PLAN) FROM "PLANNED MIXED RESIDENTIAL" TO "CITY CENTER" for GCL DEVELOPMENT GROUP, LLC. The motion carried unanimously (6-0).

WHEREAS, GCL Development Group LLC is proposing a Comprehensive Plan Amendment (Land Use Plan) from "Planned Mixed Residential" to "City Center"; and

WHEREAS, As required by ordinance, notification was advertised in the Pine Knot. A public hearing was held to consider the application at the regular meeting of the Cloquet Planning Commission on November 9, 2022, at which time Zoning Case / Development Review No. 22-16 was heard and discussed; and

WHEREAS, the property of the proposed Comprehensive Plan Amendment (Land Use Plan) is located 1417 Avenue C and the vacant lot to the west and is legally described as follows:

Lots 4 and 5, Block 1, Northwest Paper Company Addition, Carlton County, Minnesota

WHEREAS, the Planning Commission reviewed the staff report and recommends approval of the Comprehensive Plan Amendment (Land Use Plan).

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CLOQUET, MINNESOTA, that it approves of Zoning Case 22-16 for a comprehensive plan amendment (land use plan) from "Planned Mixed Residential" to "City Center".

MOTION:

Councilor Lamb moved and Councilor Jaakola seconded the motion to adopt ORDINANCE NO. 502A, AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 17 BY AMENDING THE ZONING MAP OF THE CITY OF CLOQUET FROM "R3-MULTIPLE FAMILY RESIDENCE" TO "CC-CITY CENTER". The motion carried unanimously (6-0).

The City Council of the City of Cloquet does hereby ordain as follows:

Section 1. The Zoning Map of the City of Cloquet is hereby amended to change the zoning designation of the following described property from R3 – Multiple-Family Residence to CC – City Center:

Lots 4 and 5, Block 1, Northwest Paper Company Addition, Carlton County, Minnesota.

Section 2. Effective Date. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication in accordance with law.
