Sappi Log Storage Discussion

• Mike Schultz of Sappi was present to discuss their proposal of winter wood storage in the former nursery location on Cloquet Avenue. Wood would be received between the months of December through March. Mr. Schultz stated that local storage of wood leads to lowering wood cost and will bring more investment to the Cloquet plant. The plan is to create a new road into the mill off 18th Street and making it a permanent wood yard. Discussion took place on the impacts on traffic this will create with trucks backing up on Avenue B or Cloquet Avenue waiting to be unloaded. Mr. Schultz commented impacts will be minor. Hours of delivery will remain 6:00 am to 6:00 pm but can be changed if there are neighborhood concerns.

 Mr. Cottingham has discussed leaving the hedge that surrounds the nursery to maintain a barrier.

PLA Discussion

- Follow up from the July 18, 2017 Work Session when the Council requested Mr. Helwig to ask for the Attorney General's legal opinion regarding the application of the PLA Ordinance to privately funded projects that also receive financial assistance from the City. The response from the Attorney General states that the opinion is based on a 20- year old decision and cites cases from other states having similar PLAs, however, did not give a clear opinion based on these cases. Mr. Helwig's opinion remains that the PLA ordinance recently passed by the Council is over-reaching when applied to privately funded projects.
- Mr. Reeves suggested waiting for the end of construction season for staff to reach out to
 contractors for feedback on the impacts of the PLA on their projects. Council agreed to wait for
 the feedback and will revisit in 6-8 weeks to discuss any possible amendments to the ordinance
 resulting from the information. Mr. Reeves agreed with the suggestion that was made to
 contact Duluth about any changes they may be making to their PLA.

Police Chief Hiring Discussion

- Mr. Reeves reviewed the 3 options for moving forward in the Police Chief hiring process. Several Council members' opinions were voiced and a lengthy discussion took place.
- Mayor Hallback stated he will motion to amend the regular meeting agenda by adding the
 appointment of Interim Chief Palmer to Police Chief. Mr. Reeves commented to the Council that
 if the motion passes, as Administrator, it is his responsibility to assure the success of Mr. Palmer
 as Chief.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 6:55 p.m.

DOWNTOWN CLOQUET REVITALIZATION STRATEGY

MOTION: Councilor Bjerkness moved and Councilor Maki seconded the motion to accept the

Downtown Cloquet Revitalization Strategy. The motion carried unanimously (7-0).

APPOINTMENT OF POLICE OFFICER

MOTION: Councilor Rock moved and Councilor Langley seconded the motion to approve

the probationary appointment of Larry Sherk, effective October 23, 2017 to the position of

Police Officer. The motion carried unanimously (7-0).

APPOINTMENT OF ADMINISTRATIVE POLICE SECRETARY

MOTION: Councilor Bailey moved and Councilor Langley seconded the motion to approve the six-

month probationary appointment of Mindy Marczak to the position of Administrative

Police Secretary. The motion carried unanimously (7-0).

APPOINTMENT OF POLICE CHIEF

MOTION: Councilor Rock moved and Councilor Langley seconded the motion to approve the

change in status of Jeff Palmer from Interim Police Chief to Police Chief, with a probationary period of one year, effective immediately. The motion carried (4-3),

Councilors Bjerkness, Kolodge and Maki opposed.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

- Barb Wyman, Nelson Road, congratulated the Council on the decision to appoint Jeff Palmer to Chief of Police. Ms. Nelson stated that she has heard positive feedback from officers that the police department is functioning well since the appointment of Mr. Palmer to Interim Chief in March.
- Jan Anderson, West Taylor Avenue, addressed the Council on her disappointment in the lack of an open process with former Police Chief Stracek's investigation and outcome when it was clear the community wanted an open process. Ms. Anderson also voiced her concern over the unprofessional behavior of Council members during the Work Session.
- Mike Pappas, 17th Street, questioned why the City isn't following a proper decision-making process. The current problems the city is facing is caused by a closed process. The position of Interim Chief should not guarantee the promotion to Chief.
- Wade Lamirande, Roland Road, shared his disappointment in the decision to not have an outside method in hiring a Chief. Mr. Lamirande shared his background and the steps that lead to his previous appointment to Chief and the difference now. He agrees with hiring from within the police department but through a procedure. Mr. Lamirande stated his hope for success for Mr. Palmer and the police department.
- Chris Pappas, 17th Street, stated his disappointment in the lack of a procedure in this Police Chief appointment. If Mr. Palmer is the best candidate, he would rise to the top during a search process. The Council is doing a disservice to the City by not having a vetting process.

ITEM DESCRIPTION:

Home for the Holidays Celebration

Proposed Action

Staff recommends that the City Council move to approve the closure of Industrial Avenue from 14th Street to 15th Street, and Cloquet Avenue from 18th Street to 6th Street on December 2, 2017 from 3:30 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. for the Holiday Hustle race and Home for the Holidays parade; discuss the recognition of this event as a community event for liability insurance purposes; authorize the execution of contract for fireworks display; and the use of the City's parking lot at 1111 Cloquet Avenue.

Background/Overview

Enclosed the City Council will find a request from Alyson Leno, representing the Home for the Holidays Celebration, seeking approval to hold the event and related activities again this year. The event will kick off with the 1 mile Holiday Hustle before the start of the parade. Fireworks are also being displayed and the "Agreement" is attached. The Council is asked to allow the City to enter into a contract with Pyrotechnic display, Inc. for the fireworks display. The City also is the contracting party for the 4th of July fireworks.

The remainder of items described will be held at Voyagers, Spallord and Votcrans Parks as they have in the past.

In addition to the parade, there are two items that require City Council discussion. First, the celebration committee is asking that the City recognize the event as a City sponsored event. Thus, the event and volunteers working on the event would fall under the City's Event Liability coverage. This celebration has historically been sponsored and coordinated by the business community. The City is currently assisting in the preparation for the event by funding the Events Coordinator position. There is no additional cost to the City in regard to its Event Liability insurance if the Council were to designate this as a community event.

Second, the event organizers are asking to utilize the City's parking lot on the corner of 11th Street and Cloquet Avenue as a gathering place and with fire barrels placed on the property. The City has previously allowed such activity on this lot. If allowed, the fire barrels will be arranged in a way that no damage can occur to the lot.

Policy Objectives

The support of this type of community event is not directly addressed in any City policy or ordinance. The objective of this event is to promote community pride and encourage both local residents and non-local shoppers to participate. Support would be consistent with the City's decision to ask its Event Coordinator to assist with the event.

Financial/Budget/Grant Considerations

Some staff is required for clean-up and barricading of streets. The insurance costs will fall under the City's existing liability coverage. There will be some direct cost to the City as it relates to garbage removal. Finally, the lighting and electricity use in the parks will result in some direct costs to the City.

PYROTECHNIC DISPLAY, INC. FIREWORKS DISPLAY AGREEMENT

This agreement is entered into this 24th day of October, 2017 between Pyrotechnic Display, Inc., a Minnesota Corporation with offices in Clear Lake, Minnesota, ("Pyrotechnic") and City of Cloquet of the City of Cloquet State of Minnesota ("Customer"), for the purchase of a fireworks display. ("Agreement")

SECTION 1 FIREWORKS DISPLAY

Pyrotechnic agrees to furnish for the Customer (1) fireworks display(s), as per the specifications agreed to and made part of this Agreement, on the evening of <u>December 2, 2017</u> ("Fireworks Display").

SECTION 2 CONTRACT PRICE

In consideration for the Fireworks Display, Customer agrees to pay Pyrotechnic the sum of § 3,500 ______,

dollars) which includes all taxes ("Contract Price"). A service fee of 2% per month shall be added to the Contract Price, or any portion of the Contract Price due, if it is not paid within 30 days of the date payment becomes due under this Agreement.

SECTION 3 MATERIALS AND SERVICES

Pyrotechnic shall be responsible for providing inventory meeting the specifications for the Fireworks Display, and the services of an operator who will be responsible for preparing and conducting the Fireworks Display. Pyrotechnic shall prepare a final design prior to the Fireworks Display, and the exact specifications will be supplied to the Customer after the final design, upon request-

SECTION 4 INSURANCE

Pyrotechnic Display, Inc. shall obtain a Public Liability and Property Damage and Workers Compensation Insurance. Those entities/individuals listed on the certificate of insurance shall be deemed an additional insured per this contract.

SECTION 5 LOCATION

Customer shall be responsible for providing a suitable location for the Fireworks Display. Customer shall cooperate with Pyrotechnic to ensure that the site is suitable for the Fireworks Display, and Pyrotechnic shall have the right to reject a proposed site for lack of accessibility, fire or other safety reasons.

In addition to providing the location, Customer shall be responsible for:

- Providing an appropriate staging area, and a minimum spectator setback of 350 feet.
- Providing for the staging area to be roped off or otherwise clearly marked as off limits to unauthorized personnel.
- Scarching the fallout area at first light following a nighttime display.
- Providing security, police and fire protection, to ensure 1) that the staging area and the surrounding setback area will be free from unauthorized persons, and 2) the safety of people in or around the display location.

SECTION 6 WEATHER RELATED POSTPONEMENT AND CANCELLATION.

Customer acknowledges that the Fireworks Display will be provided so long as weather, and weather related conditions, including but not limited to drought and fire risk, permit. If weather or weather related conditions, in the sole discretion of Pyrotechnic, prevent the Fireworks Display on the agreed upon date, the Fireworks Display shall be postponed. In the event of a postponement of the Fireworks display, Customer shall be responsible for payment of 20% of the Contract Price, which shall be due within 30 days of the date agreed to in Section 1. If Customer does not reschedule the Fireworks Display within the twelve-month period, an additional 30% of the Contract Price shall be due from the Customer for damages and expenses relating to the cancellation.

If customer chooses to postpone or cancel the Fireworks Display for any reason, customer shall be responsible for payment of the Contract Price as follows:

- At any time prior to the scheduled date of the Fireworks Display, 5% of the Contract Price.
- At any time on the scheduled date for the Fireworks Display, 20% of the Contract Price.
- After the commencement of the Fireworks Display, where Pyrotechnic's operator has not determined that the
 postponement is necessary for weather or weather related circumstances, 100% of the Contract Price.

SECTION 7 INDEMNIFICATION

Customer shall indemnify, defend, and hold Pyrotechnic and its shareholders, officers, employees, agents, insurers, and representative harmless from all demands, claims, causes of action, judgments, or liability, including costs and attorneys' fees, arising from damage or destruction of property, bodily injuries, tort, contract, or otherwise. Said indemnification shall include occurrences relating to gross negligence or willful misconduct of the Customer or its employees, agents, contractors or representatives, or the failure of the Customer to comply with its obligations and responsibilities as set forth in this Agreement.

Pyrotechnic shall indemnify, defend, and hold Customer harmless from all demands, claims, causes of action, judgments, or liability, including without limitation costs and attorneys' fees, arising from damage or destruction of property, bodily injuries, tort, contract, or otherwise. Cloquet Country Club Beer and On-Sale Liquor Sales at CARC

Proposed Action

Staff recommends that the City Council move to authorize the Cloquet Country Club to allow for the sale of beer and limited selection of hard alcohol products at the Cloquet Area Recreation Center (Northwoods Arena) as part of the Home for the Holidays Cloquet versus Duluth East alumni hockey game to be held on December 2, 2017 under all the same conditions that the Cloquet Country Club follows for other licensed games.

Background/Overview

This past September, the City Council authorized the Cloquet Country Club to sell beer and a limited selection of hard alcohol products at the Cloquet Area Recreation Center (Northwoods Areaa) for a period expiring June 30, 2018. This approval authorizes the sale only during the specific games included on the Minnesota Wilderness Junior A hockey game schedule.

The arena, through the extension of the Cloquet Country Club's license, was permitted to sell during the 2017-2018 season. The City has also historically allowed beer and intoxicating liquor to be sold at CARC for a wide variety of special events. Typically, these special events have been allowed through the issuance of temporary licenses to local non-profit organizations.

Under Minnesota Statutes 340A.404, Subdivision 4, the governing body of a municipality may authorize a holder of a retail on-sale intoxicating liquor license issued by the municipality to dispense intoxicating liquor at any convention, banquet, conference, meeting or social affair conducted on the premises of a sports, convention, or cultural facility owned by the municipality. Both the City Attorney and State of Minnesota have confirmed that CARC qualifies for sales under this section of State law. The addition of this one game to the licensing process is compliant with Statute.

During last season's game schedule, the City received no complaints regarding the sale of alcohol at the facility. There were no major issues related to problems or involvement of law enforcement.

This request is being made by the Cloquet Chamber of Commerce and the Minnesota Wilderness as the sponsoring parties of an adult alumni hockey game as part of the Home for the Holidays community celebration. There will be no minors or current members of the either high school team participating in the event.

Zoning Case 17-16: Easement Vacation — Vacating a portion of the East/West Drainage and Utility Easement located South of 2005 Grant

Avenue

Proposed Action

The Planning Commission recommends the City Council move to adopt RESOLUTION NO. 17-86, A RESOLUTION APPROVING THE VACATION OF A PORTION OF THE EAST/WEST DRAINAGE AND UTILITY EASEMENT LYING SOUTH OF 2005 GRANT AVENUE.

Background/Overview

Nathan Radoush is proposing to vacate a portion of the east/west drainage and utility easement lying south of 2005 GrantAvenue. This request results from a portion of the right-of-way for Grant Avenue, west of 21st Street, being vacated in 2004. The easement was preserved because of utilities located within the right-of-way. Mr. Radoush is proposing to vacate the south 20 feet of the total easement leaving 40 feet of the easement. There are no utilities located within this 20 feet.

The right-of-way for Grant Avenue between 20th Street and 21st Street was vacated at two separate times. In 2002 the westerly portion was vacated along with the utility easement since there were no utilities in this portion of the right-of-way. In 2004 the westerly 100 feet of the easterly portion was vacated, however, a utility easement was maintained over the entire 60 feet because different utilities were located within the right-of-way. These utilities consisted of a gas line, sewer and water lines and a phone line located in a portion of the right-of-way. The gas line has been removed and the other utilities are located in the northern portion of the easement.

It is anticipated that a petition will be submitted to vacate the remainder of Grant Avenue west of 21st Street in the near future. In 2004 when the portion was vacated, Grant Avenue had not been constructed and there was discussion that a temporary cut-de-sac might be constructed, thus a portion of the right-of-way west of 21st Street was preserved.

A Public Hearing was held on Tuesday, October 24, 2017 to consider a possible casement vacation. A legal notice was published in the Pine Journal on October 5, 2017 and effected property owners were sent notices of the public hearing.

Policy Objectives

The purpose of this Vacation application is to ensure that MN State Statute 160.29 and 412.851 are followed in giving up rights to property. There is no formal requirement on determining if an easement should be vacated. It is really up to a common-sense approach as to whether there is currently, or will be in the future, a need for the easement that is being vacated.

Financial/Budget/Grant Considerations

The filing fee for the vacation of an easement is \$350.00. The applicant has paid that fee.

The Planning Commission noted this portion of the easement was no longer needed since the utilities had been relocated out of this portion of the property. The Planning Commission has recommended approval of the Vacation on a 3-0 vote.

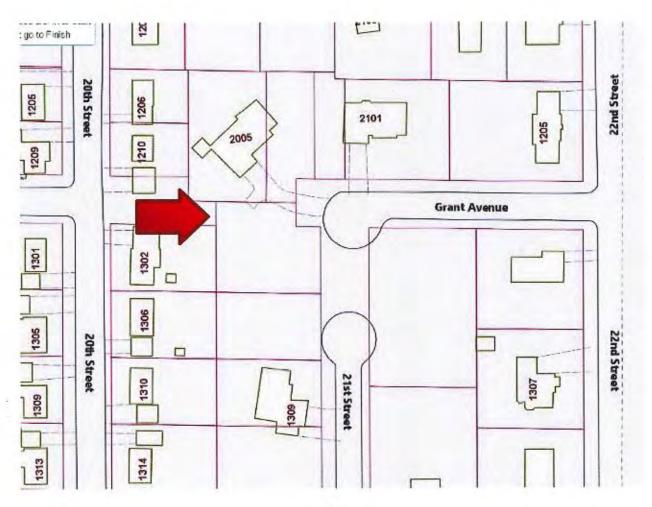

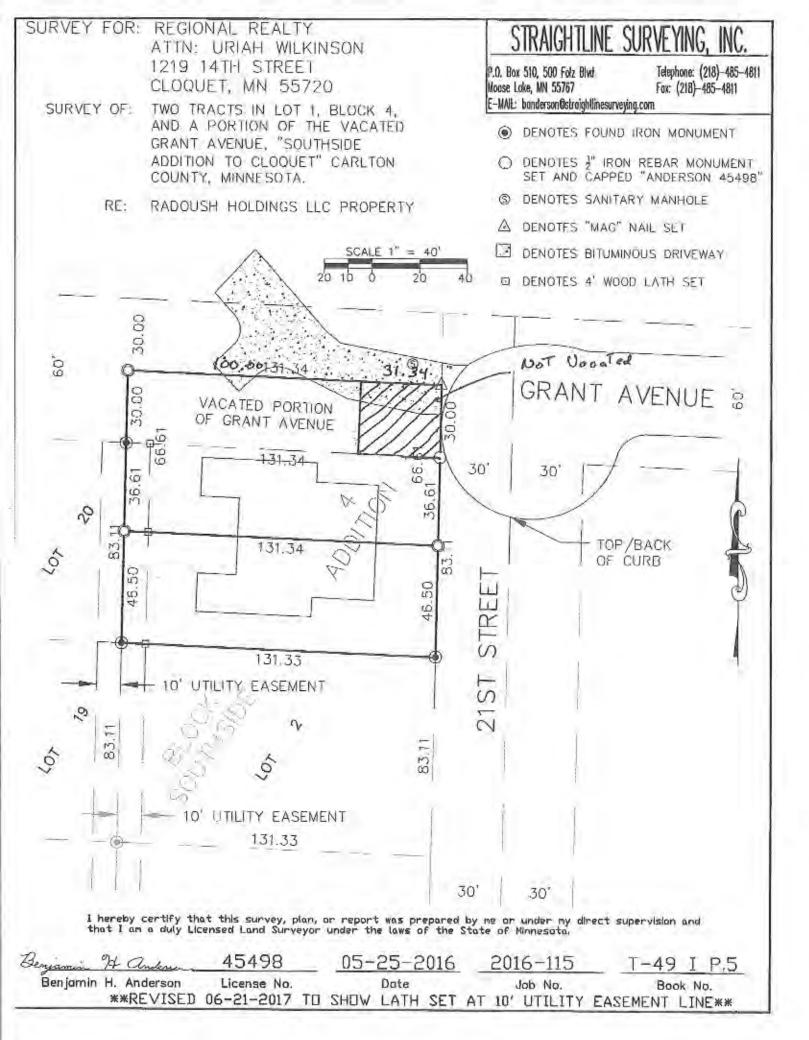

Proposed Action

The Planning Commission recommends the City Council move to adopt RESOLUTION NO. 17-87, A RESOLUTION APPROVING SAND AND GRAVEL EXCAVATION PERMIT RENEWALS FOR 2018.

Background/Overview

All sand and gravel mining and processing operations require an annual excavation permit. The excavation permit is an annual permit issued at the discretion of the City and does not confer or grant a property right. Prior to renewal of these permits, staff visits each pit to examine the conditions to ensure that zoning ordinance requirements are being met. The excavation permits were considered at the regular Planning Commission meeting on October 24, 2017.

Inspections of active gravel mining operations were conducted in October in accordance with Chapter 17 Section 6.20 Subdivision 8 of the Cloquet Zoning Ordinance. Attached the Council will find reports on the annual gravel mine inspections for the four operating within the City.

Upon inspection of the Zack Sand and Gravel Pit it is noted that the approved haul/access road from the pit to the intersection of Stark and Freeman Roads is working very well. Staff has not received any complaints regarding this pit.

The Ulland pit had an asphalt plant located in the pit at various times this summer. Staff did receive complaints about the odor from the asphalt plant on certain days but none about the other operations.

The KGM pit is used primarily for KGM and the wood chip operation for Sappi. They had a large amount of activity from this pit this year. They also had an asphalt plant located in the pit at various times this summer. The City received no complaints on the KGM pit.

The Carlton County pit is used primarily for stockpiling material and not much mining anymore. The millings from different projects have been stored there. The City received no complaints on the County pit.

Policy Objectives

The purpose of the annual excavation permit renewal is to ensure that operations at the gravel mining operations comply with Ordinance requirements.

Financial/Budget/Grant Considerations

The Annual Excavation Permit renewal fee is \$300. An updated bond is required of all applicants along with a questionnaire and on-site inspection by City staff.

Background/Overview

Mn/DOT is currently working to prepare bid documents for a planned project along Highway 33 at Interstate 35. The project involves replacement of the existing intersection of TH 33, the Interstate 35 ramps and the west frontage road with a roundabout.

As part of the planned improvements, the State has identified the frontage road to be under the jurisdiction of the City of Cloquet. The project cost attributable to the frontage road would typically be paid by the City of Cloquet, however the City obtained funding through MnDOT SEC164 which will cover any City costs associated with the project.

As part of this Cooperative Agreement, the City is agreeing to maintain the Frontage Road west access to the roundabout. This maintenance includes, but is not limited to, snow, ice and debris removal, resurfacing, seal coating, and any other maintenance activities according to accepted City maintenance practices.

Policy Objectives

To work cooperatively with other State and Federal agencies on such projects of mutual interest.

Financial Impacts

There are no construction costs to the City as part of this construction project. The City will continue to be financially responsible for maintenance cost on the west frontage road as we have been prior to this project.

This Agreement is between the State of Minnesota, acting through its Commissioner of Transportation ("State") and City of Cloquet acting through its City Council ("City").

Recitals

- The State will perform roundabout, grading, concrete and bituminous paving, ADA improvements and lighting construction and other associated construction upon, along and adjacent to Trunk Highway (T.H.) No. 33 from Trunk Highway No. 35 and southbound Trunk Highway No. 33 Entrance Ramp to 500 feet north of the Frontage Road according to State-prepared plans, specifications and special provisions designated by the State as State Project No. 0905-54 (T.H. 33=055) ("Project"); and
- 2. The City has requested the State include in its Project Frontage Road construction; and
- The City wishes to participate in the costs of the Frontage Road construction and associated construction engineering; and
- Federal MnDOT SEC 164 funds are available for the City's share of the construction and construction engineering; and
- Minnesota Statutes § 161.20, subdivision 2 authorizes the Commissioner of Transportation to make arrangements with and cooperate with any governmental authority for the purposes of constructing, maintaining and improving the trunk highway system.

Agreement

1. Term of Agreement; Survival of Terms; Plans; Incorporation of Exhibits

- 1.1. Effective Date. This Agreement will be effective on the date the State obtains all signatures required by Minnesota Statutes § 16C.05, subdivision 2.
- 1.2. Expiration Date. This Agreement will expire when all obligations have been satisfactorily fulfilled.
- 1.3. Survival of Terms. All clauses which impose obligations continuing in their nature and which must survive in order to give effect to their meaning will survive the expiration or termination of this Agreement, including, without limitation, the following clauses: 3. Maintenance by the City; 8. Liability; Worker Compensation Claims; 10. State Audits; 11. Government Data Practices; 12. Governing Law; Jurisdiction; Venue; and 14. Force Majeure.
- 1.4. Plans, Specifications, Special Provisions. Plans, specifications and special provisions designated by the State as State Project No. 0905-54 (T.H. 33=055) are on file in the office of the Commissioner of Transportation at St. Paul, Minnesota, and incorporated into this Agreement by reference ("Project Plans").
- 1.5. Exhibits. Preliminary Schedule "I" is on file in the office of the City Engineer and incorporated into this Agreement by reference.

2. Construction by the State

2.1. Contract Award. The State will advertise for bids and award a construction contract to the lowest responsible bidder according to the Project Plans.

2.2. Direction, Supervision and Inspection of Construction.

- A. Supervision and Inspection by the State. The State will direct and supervise all construction activities performed under the construction contract, and perform all construction engineering and inspection functions in connection with the contract construction. All contract construction will be performed according to the Project Plans.
- B. Inspection by the City. The City participation construction covered under this Agreement will be open to inspection by the City. If the City believes the City participation construction covered under this Agreement has not been properly performed or that the construction is defective, the City will inform the State District Engineer's authorized representative in writing of those defects. Any recommendations made by the City are not binding on the State. The State will have the exclusive right to determine whether the State's contractor has satisfactorily performed the City participation construction covered under this Agreement.

2.3. Plan Changes, Additional Construction, Etc.

- A. The State will make changes in the Project Plans and contract construction, which may include the City participation construction covered under this Agreement, and will enter into any necessary addenda and change orders with the State's contractor that are necessary to cause the contract construction to be performed and completed in a satisfactory manner. The State District Engineer's authorized representative will inform the appropriate City official of any proposed addenda and change orders to the construction contract that will affect the City participation construction covered under this Agreement.
- B. The City may request additional work or changes to the work in the plans as part of the construction contract. Such request will be made by an exchange of letter(s) with the State. If the State determines that the requested additional work or plan changes are necessary or desirable and can be accommodated without undue disruption to the project, the State will cause the additional work or plan changes to be made.
- 2.4. Satisfactory Completion of Contract. The State will perform all other acts and functions necessary to cause the construction contract to be completed in a satisfactory manner.

3. Maintenance by the City

Upon completion of the project, the City will provide the following without cost or expense to the State

3.1. Roadways. Maintenance of Frontage Road west access to the roundabout. Maintenance includes, but is not limited to, snow, ice and debris removal, resurfacing and seal coating and any other maintenance activities according to accepted City maintenance practices.

4. Basis of City Cost

- 4.1. Schedule "I". The Preliminary Schedule "I" includes all anticipated City participation construction items and the construction engineering cost share covered under this Agreement, and is based on engineer's estimated unit prices.
- 4.2. City Participation Construction. The City will participate in the following at the percentages indicated. The construction includes the City's proportionate share of item costs for as built, mobilization, combination field laboratory-office and traffic control.
 - A. 100 Percent minus MnDOT SEC164 will be the City's rate of cost participation in all of the construction items tabulated on Sheets No. 2 through No. 4 of the Preliminary Schedule "I".

- 4.3. Construction Engineering Costs. The City will pay a construction engineering charge equal to 8 percent of the total City participation construction covered under this Agreement. MnDOT SEC 164 funds will be applied to the construction engineering.
- 4.4. Plan Changes, Additional Construction, Etc. The City will share in the costs of construction contract addenda and change orders that are necessary to complete the City participation construction covered under this Agreement, including any City requested additional work and plan changes.

The State reserves the right to invoice the City for the cost of any additional City requested work and plan changes, construction contract addenda, change orders and associated construction engineering before the completion of the contract construction.

4.5. Liquidated Damages. All liquidated damages assessed the State's contractor in connection with the construction contract will result in a credit shared by each party in the same proportion as their total construction cost share covered under this Agreement is to the total contract construction cost before any deduction for liquidated damages.

5. City Cost and Payment by the City

- 5.1. City Cost. \$150,940.36 minus MnDOT SEC164 funding is the City's estimated share of the costs of the contract construction and the 8 percent construction engineering cost share as shown in the Preliminary Schedule "I". The Preliminary Schedule "I" was prepared using estimated quantities and unit prices, and may include any credits or lump sum costs. Upon award of the construction contract, the State will prepare a Revised Schedule "I" based on construction contract unit prices, which will replace and supersede the Preliminary Schedule "I" as part of this Agreement.
- 5.2. Final Payment, Additional City Requested Work. Upon completion of all contract construction and upon computation of the final amount due the State's contractor, and only if additional work has been requested under article 2.3B of this agreement, the State will prepare a Final Schedule "I" and submit a copy to the City. The Final Schedule "I" will be based on final quantities of any additional City requested participation construction items and the construction engineering cost share due to additional requested work. The computation by the State of the amount due from the City will be final, binding, and conclusive.

The State and the City waive claims for any payments or refunds less than \$5.00 according to Minnesota Statutes § 15.415.

6. Authorized Representatives

Each party's Authorized Representative is responsible for administering this Agreement and is authorized to give and receive any notice or demand required or permitted by this Agreement.

7. Assignment; Amendments; Waiver; Contract Complete

- 7.1. Assignment. Neither party may assign or transfer any rights or obligations under this Agreement without the prior consent of the other party and a written assignment agreement, executed and approved by the same parties who executed and approved this Agreement, or their successors in office.
- 7.2. Amendments. Any amendment to this Agreement must be in writing and will not be effective until it has been executed and approved by the same parties who executed and approved the original Agreement, or their successors in office.
- 7.3. Waiver. If a party fails to enforce any provision of this Agreement, that failure does not waive the provision or the party's right to subsequently enforce it.
- 7.4. Contract Complete. This Agreement contains all prior negotiations and agreements between the State and the City. No other understanding regarding this Agreement, whether written or oral, may be used to bind either party.

8. Liability; Worker Compensation Claims

- 8.1. Each party is responsible for its own acts, omissions and the results thereof to the extent authorized by law and will not be responsible for the acts and omissions of others and the results thereof. Minnesota Statutes § 3.736 and other applicable law govern liability of the State. Minnesota Statutes Chapter 466 and other applicable law govern liability of the City.
- 8.2. Each party is responsible for its own employees for any claims arising under the Workers Compensation Act.

9. Nondiscrimination

Provisions of Minnesota Statutes § 181.59 and of any applicable law relating to civil rights and discrimination are considered part of this Agreement.

10. State Audits

Under Minnesota Statutes § 16C.05, subdivision 5, the City's books, records, documents, and accounting procedures and practices relevant to this Agreement are subject to examination by the State and the State Auditor or Legislative Auditor, as appropriate, for a minimum of six years from the end of this Agreement.

11. Government Data Practices

The City and State must comply with the Minnesota Government Data Practices Act, Minnesota Statutes Chapter 13, as it applies to all data provided under this Agreement, and as it applies to all data created, collected, received, stored, used, maintained, or disseminated by the City under this Agreement. The civil remedies of Minnesota Statutes §13.08 apply to the release of the data referred to in this clause by either the City or the State.

12. Governing Law; Jurisdiction; Venue

Minnesota law governs the validity, interpretation and enforcement of this Agreement. Venue for all legal proceedings arising out of this Agreement, or its breach, must be in the appropriate state or federal court with competent jurisdiction in Ramsey City, Minnesota.

13. Termination; Suspension

- 13.1. By Mutual Agreement. This Agreement may be terminated by mutual agreement of the parties.
- 13.2. Termination for Insufficient Funding. The State may immediately terminate this Agreement if it does not obtain funding from the Minnesota Legislature, or other funding source; or if funding cannot be continued at a level sufficient to allow for the performance of contract construction under the Project. Termination must be by written or fax notice to the City.

13.3. Suspension. In the event of a total or partial government shutdown, the State may suspend this Agreement and all work, activities and performance of work authorized through this Agreement.

14. Force Majeure

Neither party will be responsible to the other for a failure to perform under this Agreement (or a delay in performance), if such failure or delay is due to a force majeure event. A force majeure event is an event beyond a party's reasonable control, including but not limited to, unusually severe weather, fire, floods, other acts of God, labor disputes, acts of war or terrorism, or public health emergencies.
