ORDINANCE NO. 511A – AMENDING CHAPTER 17 ZONING MAP, FIRST READING

Council is asked to review **ORDINANCE NO. 511A, AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 17 BY AMENDING THE ZONING MAP OF THE CITY OF CLOQUET FROM "LI-LIGHT INDUSTRY" TO "R2 ONE-AND TWO-FAMILY RESIDENCE".** The second reading will take place May 7, 2024.

The City Council of the City of Cloquet does hereby ordain as follows:

Section 1. The Zoning Map of the City of Cloquet is hereby amended to change the zoning designation of the following described property from LI – Light Industry to R2 – One- and Two-Family Residence:

Lots 1-5, Block 1, City of Cloquet Colburns Addition, Carlton County, Minnesota.

Section 2. Effective Date. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication in accordance with law.





Proposed Action

Staff recommends that the City Council move to approve the revised Arena Lease Agreement between the City of Cloquet and Minnesota Wilderness.

Background/Overview

The City, Minnesota Wilderness, School District and Hockey Association (CAHA) have operated and utilized a skating rink and arena cooperatively since at least 1975. The Agreement has been amended and revised numerous times since 1975 and details the various financial usage and other obligations of these parties. The most current lease expired on June 30, 2024.

The attached Agreement has already been approved by the Minnesota Wilderness. There are no other proposed changes to the Agreement at this time.

RECITALS

1. The City is the owner of certain real property located in Cloquet, Carlton County, Minnesota, and as described as follows, to-wit:

Southwest Quarter of the Southeast Quarter of the Southwest Quarter (sw ¼ of se ¼ of sw ¼), Section Twenty-three (23), Township Forty-nine (49), Range Seventeen (17), West.

- 2. The City has requested that a new lease agreement by and between the parties be entered into which agreement would continue to provide revenue to the City to permit the necessary operation, improvements, and updating of the existing facility so as to permit a continued quality arena facility.
- 3. That the parties hereto have agreed that the City, in order to operate the facilities for the general public for the citizens of Cloquet and for the Cloquet Area School District for recreation programs, school programs, Cloquet Area Hockey Association programs, open skating programs, WILDERNESS team and for other uses for the general public and the citizens of Cloquet, must receive additional rentals to enable them to meet their requirements for operation and improvement and maintenance of the present facility.
- 4. The City has constructed on the above-described real property an ice arena.
- 5. The parties hereto are desirous of obtaining maximum usage of the above-described real property and the ice arena located thereon by their respective residents and/or members and, in particular, are desirous of maintaining and improving the existing structure.
- 6. That the parties hereto have agreed that the financial contributions of the City for a community recreation program for City and general public uses and the lease agreement for the WILDERNESS will be entered into in order to allow the City to undertake the projects necessary to meet State guidelines for such a structure and to finance the necessary obligations for the daily operations of the structure.
- 7. The parties hereto desire to enter into a lease agreement to insure the foregoing.

TERMS OF AGREEMENT

1. <u>Subject Property.</u> The property being subject of this Agreement is the following described property and the ice arena located therein in Cloquet, Carlton County, Minnesota, to-wit:

Southwest Quarter of the Southeast Quarter of the Southwest Quarter (sw ¼ of se ¼ of sw ¼), Section Twenty-three (23), Township Forty-nine (49), Range Seventeen (17), West.

- 2. <u>Term.</u> The term of this lease shall be a period of three (3) years commencing July 1, 2024, and terminating June 30, 2027.
 - a. This lease, on its effective date, supersedes and cancels any existing leases and/or extensions.
 - b. This lease will automatically renew each year unless either party provides written notice of its intent to terminate this agreement at least 30 days prior to a new lease year beginning (June 1, 2025 or June 1, 2026).
 - c. If arena is unable to be used or occupied during normal operating times for a period longer than 30 continuous days, both parties agree to open lease negotiations.

- 3. Financial Contribution of the WILDERNESS. Contributions of the WILDERNESS upon execution hereof shall be made in accordance with the following schedule:
 - Α. Facility Rental – (Three Years)

- 4. Use of Payments. The parties hereto agree that the sums to be paid to the City hereunder shall be used as per paragraph six (6) of the recitals, and shall further be used for the operational and maintenance expenses of said facility during the term of this agreement.
- Use of Facility by WILDERNESS. WILDERNESS shall have the non-exclusive use of the RINK for the 5. purpose of training, hosting practices ("Practices") and games ("Games") that will be attended by spectators as part of the North American Hockey League ("NAHL"). The programs for which said facility may be used shall include, but not be limited to, the following:
 - WILDERNESS Hockey Program: a.
 - Ι. 180-200 hours of practice time per season between the hours of 8:00 am and 2:45 pm Monday - Friday. Beginning last week of August and ending after the season completion in early May dependent on playoff status.
 - 28 regular season home games between Sept. through early May each year. WILDERNESS II. will work in conjunction with the City or its assignee to minimize any scheduling conflicts. Use of Community Room included.
 - Year round use of the training room. WILDERNESS agrees to maintain and furnish all III. required training equipment. Scheduling of use of training room by other parties will be done through the WILDERNESS. Only high school or older aged users are allowed.
 - IV. Camp between mid-May and late June of each year for one week each event to evaluate protentional players and establish team rosters.
 - V. WILDERNESS shall have a team locker room for exclusive use during all practices and games. The locker rooms shall also be made available to WILDERNESS at any time a hockey camp is scheduled at the Facility. Other than for dropping off equipment after a game, locker rooms shall not be used after facility closing hours unless prior authorization is obtained. CITY shall have no responsibility to clean WILDERNESSS's team locker room as WILDERNESS will assume that responsibility. The CITY shall provide a visiting team locker room with access to showers during home game(s) series at the facility.
 - VI. Community/Party Room to be used for meeting purposes and key sponsorship personnel during home games.
 - VII. The right to sell and promote special outdoor events during wilderness games. This would include live music, food, and beverages. These events must first be approved by City to ensure events meet all city code and state statutes.
 - VIII. The right to sell or contract with outside agency to sell alcoholic beverage during home games.
 - IX. The facility shall further be made available to WILDERNESS for such other programs, at times and dates to be scheduled jointly with the CITY or its assigned.
- Combined Use of Facility by Cloquet Area Hockey Association, WILDERNESS, Cloquet School District 6. and City. The use of the above-described facility shall be made available during the ice season for the implementation of existing youth hockey programs, school district hockey programs, WILDERNESS hockey program as well as programs which may be developed. The times and dates thereof shall be scheduled by the City or its assignee.

- 7. <u>Obligations of the City</u>. The City, or its assignee shall, during the term of this Agreement, provide the following:
 - a. The care and maintenance of the facility and equipment within the facility during the term of this Agreement, except the equipment described in 5(a)(iii).
 - b. The care and maintenance of the ice in the facility during the term of this Agreement.
 - c. The necessary equipment for the care and maintenance of the ice during the term of this Agreement.
 - d. Custodial services for the entire building during the term of this Agreement.
 - e. The high-speed internet meeting the NAHL requirement for NHAL TV broadcast of each game.
 - f. All utilities during the term of this Agreement.
 - g. Insurance on said facility and said equipment as required during the term of this Agreement.
- 8. <u>Additional Responsibilities of WILDERNESS</u>. During games played pursuant to its WILDERNESS Hockey Schedule, the WILDERNESS agrees to provide the following:
 - a. Box Workers.
 - b. Clock Operator.
 - c. Official Scorer.
 - d. Announcer.
 - e. Light Show Operator.
 - f. Bartenders.
 - g. Apparel Sales Person.
 - h. Ticket Taker.
 - i. Security Personnel.
 - j. Liability insurance coverage for spectators and non-participants. This coverage may be limited to provide protection to the WILDERNESS against claims or suits arising out of personal injury to any spectator or non-participant in WILDERNESS games, in an amount not less than \$2,000,000 per occurrence with the City named as an additional insured.
 - k. Liquor license and liquor liability insurance in the minimum amount of \$1,000,000 per occurrence with the City named as an additional insured.
- 9. <u>Concessions.</u> It is understood by the parties that the concessions within said facility shall, during the terms of this agreement, be operated by the City or its assignee except as provided in 5(a)(vii)(viii).
- 10. <u>Alcohol.</u> WILDERNESS shall have the exclusive right to market and sell fermented malt-beverages at the Facility during games in accordance with Minnesota statutes and City code. WILDERNESS shall be responsible for ensuring that they or any entity that is hired to sell alcohol on site has any and all required permits. WILDERNESS shall be required to order, staff, and maintain an inventory of products to sell at games. Any revenue derived from the sale of fermented malt beverages shall be retained by WILDERNESS.
- 11. Advertising. WILDERNESS shall have exclusive rights to sell advertising within the rink facility except as provided in this section or subject to CITY agreements as set forth in ADDENDUM A. Parties agree to amend Addendum A only by written agreement of both parties. Facility advertising areas shall include and pertain to dasher boards, rink walls, bleachers, banners, on-ice logos (excluding center ice Lumberjack logo), glass wrap, and lobby.

CITY shall have the sole and exclusive right to sell and license all naming rights to the building and Zamboni wrap during the term of this Agreement.

As to the effective date of the Agreement, the CITY has advertising rights of certain Signs whereas the WILDERNESS will honor these agreements. The CITY sponsored advertising signs shall be clarified in ADDENDUM A with Name and Area as mutually agreed between Parties within this Agreement.

WILDERNESS shall be responsible for expense and design of any Advertising and the CITY, or its assignee, shall be responsible for the installation of any advertising. Any and all revenue derived from such Advertising shall be the property of WILDERNESS.

WILDERNESS agrees that all advertising shall comply with all federal, state, and municipal laws and regulations with respect to the advertising matter to be displayed.

CITY reserves the right to approve any and all advertising prior to display at the Facility. Except for temporary game-day beer sales, WILDERNESS shall not display advertising for businesses that solely derive revenue from the sale of tobacco, firearms, adult entertainment and/or other practices considered unsuitable or inappropriate for children, unless written permission from CITY.

WILDERNESS shall indemnify and hold CITY harmless from any suits, claims, damages, costs, or expenses arising in connection with false, defamatory, obscene, or otherwise unlawful advertising material which has been sold, ordered, or approved by WILDERNESS.

- 12. <u>Management of Facility.</u> The facility described herein shall be subject to the supervision of the City or its assignee.
 - a. Day-to-day management and control of the facility shall be vested in the City or its assignee
- 13. Insurance-City. The City agrees that, during the term of this Agreement, it will carry liability insurance with an approved insurance company of the League of Minnesota Cities Insurance Trust (LMCIT) in amounts not less than those specified in Minnesota Statutes, Chapter 466 and casualty insurance with an approved insurance company or LMCIT in such amounts as will cover the replacement value of the facility and related equipment. The WILDERNESS shall be named an additional insured on the City's liability coverage. The insurance shall not be canceled without consent of the WILDERNESS and the City. Such insurance shall specifically include the coverage of the structures, contents, and the liquid Freon ice plant, it being the intention of the parties hereto that the payment obligations hereunder shall be contingent upon the continuing availability of ice.
- 14. <u>Liability and Indemnification</u>. The parties agree that they will, subject to any indemnification provisions provided herein, be responsible for their own acts and the results thereof to the extent authorized by law, and they shall not be responsible for the acts of the other party and the results thereof. To the fullest extent permitted by law, each party agrees to defend, indemnify and hold harmless the other party, and its employees, officials, and agents from and against all claims, actions, damages, losses and expenses, including reasonable attorney fees, arising out of a party's negligence or a party's failure to perform its obligations under this Lease. The parties agree their indemnity obligation shall survive the completion or termination of this Lease.
- 15. <u>Limitation of Liability</u>. It is agreed by the parties hereto that the obligations of the City with regard to the described facility shall be limited as set forth herein, and under M.S.A. 466.01 et al, except as may be otherwise agreed upon in writing by the parties hereto.
- 16. <u>Locker Room</u>. The City or its assignee shall provide appropriate maintenance and adequate locker room space for the WILDERNESS during the term of this agreement. Damages beyond normal wear and tear caused by the WILDERNESS shall be repaired by the WILDERNESS at it's expense. The "Tobacco Free" Policy shall also be enforced.

17.	Assignment. It is mutually agreed that all the terms and conditions of the Agreement shall extend, apply to and bind the successors and assigns of the respective parties hereto as fully as the respective parties are themselves bound, but this provision shall not authorize the assignment or subletting of this Agreement without the written consent of all of the parties hereto.
18.	<u>Contractual Review</u> . Prior to the start of the WILDERNESS season, a joint meeting with the City or its assignee will be conducted to review all areas related to this Agreement.

Background/Overview

The state of Minnesota provides authorizing authority for establishment of a local housing trust fund in Minnesota Statutes, Section 462C.16. The City will hold a public hearing on May 21, 2024 at 6:00PM on the establishment of a local Housing Trust Fund. The city proposes to pool Statewide Affordable Housing Aide (SAHA) and allow for additional funds to be contributed into the local housing trust fund.

The funds are transferred to a local housing trust fund. If funds are transferred to a local housing trust fund, they must be spent on a project or household that meets the affordability requirements described for this program. State statute says a local housing trust fund may only exist by ordinance and a public hearing held.



Financial/Budget/Grant Considerations

The City has a current balance of \$64,810 in SAHA funding and will receive the first 2024 bi-annual payment in July with an additional \$32,405. Beginning in 2025, aid recipients must submit a report annually, no later than December 1 of each year, to the Minnesota Housing Finance Agency. The report must include documentation of



the location of any unspent funds distributed under this section and of qualifying projects completed or planned with funds under this section. For the purposes of reporting to the Department of Revenue, funds are considered spent if placed into a local housing trust fund for which SAHA guidance can be used to direct investments.

Proposed Action

The Planning Commission recommends the City Council have the second reading of **ORDINANCE NO.** 511A, AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 17, BY AMENDING THE ZONING MAP OF THE CITY OF CLOQUET FROM "LI – LIGHT INDUSTRY" TO "R2 – ONE- AND TWO-FAMILY RESIDENCE".

Background/Overview

The City of Cloquet is proposing a Rezoning southeast of 18th Street and Avenue F. The property is guided Low Density Residential and zoned LI – Light Industry and is proposed to be zoned R2 – One-and Two-Family Residence. If approved, the existing single-family homes would be in compliance with the Ordinance.

A public hearing was held on Wednesday, April 10, 2024, to consider the Rezoning. A legal notice was published in the Pine Knot on March 29, 2024, and property owners within 350 feet were sent notice of the public hearing.

Land Use Plan and Rezoning

In August 2007 the City Council adopted the 2007 - 2027 Comprehensive Plan for the City of Cloquet. Chapter 3 of the Plan, Land Use discusses Inventory and Analysis; Goals, Objectives, and Policies; and, Land Use Plan. As part of that adoption, the property was guided on the Land Use Plan as Low Density Residential. However, the Zoning of the property was left at LI – Light Industry.

The Zoning of property is to be consistent with the Comprehensive Plan, Land Use Map and thus a rezoning of the property to R2 – One- and Two-Family Residence would be consistent with the Comprehensive Plan, Land Use Map.

Policy Objectives

The Rezoning of the property is to be consistent with the Comprehensive Plan. The property is guided Low Density Residential. The property adjacent to the west is zoned R2 – One- and Two-Family Residence.

The Rezoning of the property only requires a majority of those present.



WHEREAS, Carlton County and the City of Cloquet have agreed to transfer jurisdiction and ownership of a part of County Road 107, a county roadway, from the County to the City, as legally described on **Exhibit A**, attached hereto and made a part hereof; and,

WHEREAS, Carlton County and the City of Cloquet have further agreed for Carlton County to take over a part of Wheaton Road (a city roadway), as a county road, as legally described on **Exhibit B**, attached hereto and made a part hereof; and,

WHEREAS, the City will receive jurisdiction of that part of County Road 107 in its existing condition; and,

WHEREAS, the County will take over jurisdiction of that part of Wheaton Road in its existing condition.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CLOQUET, MINNESOTA, that the City of Cloquet agrees to accept and receive jurisdiction and ownership of that part of County Road 107 as described on Exhibit A, upon transfer made by resolution of the County Board, and that said roadway shall thereafter be maintained and improved as a city roadway of the City of Cloquet, to be known as Moorhead Road.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CLOQUET, MINNESOTA, that the City of Cloquet agrees for Carlton County to take over that part of Wheaton Road, as described on **Exhibit B**, as a county road, upon resolution of the County Board, and that said roadway shall thereafter be maintained and improved as a county road of the County of Carlton, to be known as County Road 115 (Wheaton Road).


