TOWARDS ZERO DEATHS GRANT

MOTION: Councilor Rock moved and Councilor Bjerkness seconded the motion to adopt

RESOLUTION NO. 17-75, A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CLOQUET POLICE DEPARTMENT TO ENTER INTO A GRANT AGREEMENT, IN A PARTNERSHIP WITH THE CARLTON COUNTY SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT AND FOND DU LAC POLICE DEPARTMENT, TO ACT AS THE PRIMARY AGENCY IN THE ADMINISTRATION OF THE REGIONAL TOWARDS ZERO

DEATHS GRANT. The motion carried unanimously (7-0).

WHEREAS, The Towards Zero Deaths (TZD) Program provides technical assistance, materials, and guidance to local groups that are committed to reducing crashes and fatalities; and

WHEREAS, The Cloquet Police Department has been a participating member in the TZD Program for over a decade; and

WHEREAS, In order to be awarded the TZD Grant, the Department of Public Safety requires a Resolution authorizing participation in the project; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CLOQUET, MINNESOTA, That the Cloquet Police Department be authorized to enter into a grant agreement with the Minnesota Department of Public Safety, for traffic safety enforcement projects during the period from October 1, 2017 through September 30, 2018.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Cloquet Police Department through its Interim Chief of Police, Jeff Palmer, or its Commander, Carey Ferrell, are hereby authorized to execute such agreements and amendments as necessary to implement the project on behalf of the Cloquet Police Department and to be the fiscal agent and administer the grant.

UTILITY RATE STUDY

MOTION:

Councilor Bjerkness moved and Councilor Kolodge seconded the motion to award a contract to Progressive Engineers for completion of a Utility Rate Study in the amount of \$26,550. The motion carried unanimously (7-0).

PUBLIC COMMENTS

- Jennifer Smith, Community Engagement Manager, Enridge. Ms. Smith addressed the Council on the role Enbridge plays in the community, amount of crude oil transported, the number of people Enbridge employs, right of ways, number of easements, and public meetings that have been held and are scheduled.
- John Feely, Construction Manager for Enbridge, stated the tremendous safety record at Enbridge and the safety measures that are in place. Mr. Feely invited anyone to with questions or concerns to please contact Enbridge. Mr. Feely also explained the process for deactivating the old pipeline.
- Daryl Godbout, Duluth Building and Trades representative, spoke of the job and tax base Enbridge creates. Mr. Godbout also stated that Enbridge is a safe company providing a safe place to work.
- Derek Peterson, Local 1091, stated his full support of the Line 3 project and discussed the enormous economic impact if the project is pulled.
- Jeff Devol, Plumbers and Steamfitters Local Union, expressed his support for the Line 3 project.
- Kristine Davies, Enbridge Community Outreach, addressed the Council on the support for the Line 3 project, the shared values Enbridge has with communities, and the fact that 80% of oil in MN comes through the Enbridge pipeline.
